1. Introduction

Larger donations may be subject to additional review, and we reserve the right to decline contributions that conflict with our values or could create ethical concerns.

All donations are used solely to support the initiative's programmes, outreach, and community impact. We do not engage in for-profit activities, and funds will never be used for personal gain or outside of The Niu Evolver Initiative's mission.

4. Refund Policy

We generally do not offer refunds on donations. However, if an error occurs in processing, we will review refund requests on a case-by-case basis.

- Donations do not establish a contractual relationship or entitle donors to decision-making authority over the initiative's operations.
- We are not responsible for third-party fundraising platforms; donors should review their terms before contributing.
